How do earthquakes happen?

Do you know how earthquakes happen? Well I will tell you. It works like this. So the earth is like a jigsaw puzzle. There's also twenty pieces which are called tectonic plates. Do you know that the earth is moving slowly right now? Also you can't feel it. Sometimes when the plates move quickly it can cause an earthquake. Slip strike is when tectonic plates slide past each other quickly. The epicenter is the surface where the earthquake happens. Hypocenter is the bottom of the surface where the earthquake starts. Also the tectonic plates can drift apart and make the ocean floor.

The earth is made from twenty pieces of a jigsaw puzzle. Convergent boundaries is one plate that slides under and pushes up another plate. This makes a hill and also an earthquake. Slip strike is when one plate slides quickly past each other and causes an earthquake. Divergent boundaries is when two plates quickly move apart. That creates a drift zone. That makes an earthquake. Epicenter is the surface where an earthquake starts. The hypocenter is underground also where an earthquake starts but you can't be there.

The epicenter is the surface of the earthquake.
